

Jehovah is a false god

The contrast between truth and falsehood in the Bible

The Bible emphasizes several texts in which what is true and authentic contrast radically to what is false and illusory. Thus, for example, it is written in John 1:17, "*For the law was given through Moses; grace and the **truth came through Jesus Christ***".

In this text we can read that the truth came not through the law of the Old Testament, but through the teachings of Jesus Christ. Well, if the truth came only through Jesus Christ, everything that has been heard since the Old Testament was not credible.

And now we read in another text of the Bible: ... *We know also that the Son of God has come and has given us understanding, so that we may know him who is true. And we are in him who is true by being in **his Son Jesus Christ. He is the true God and eternal life.*** (1 John 5:20)

This other text confirms that Jesus is the only true God and eternal life. Well, **if Jesus is the only true God, then we can affirm that there are other gods that are not true.**

In my opinion, Jehovah is a false god who disguises his real intentions of being higher than the absolute and true God. **Just Jesus has showed the Father how he really is.**

Jehovah's attitudes and behavior, as detailed in the Old Testament pages, prove that he is not the same as the Godfather revealed by Jesus in the New Testament.

Jesus said in Matthew 12:33 that ***a tree is recognized by its fruit***. The fruits that Jehovah has shown through his commandments in the Old Testament, such as violence, permission for retaliation, racial discrimination, incoherence and favor only for the beloved, are radically different from the fruits that Jesus presented, as God's legitimate representative of the Father, whose basic essence is love.

The apostle Paul said in 1 Corinthians 8: 5-6 that although there are many false gods and masters, the true God is the Father, whose legitimate and sole representative is his Son Jesus Christ. This is the text: ... *For even if there are so-called gods, whether in heaven or on earth (**as indeed there are many "gods" and many "lords"**), yet **for us there is but one God, the Father**, from whom all things came and for whom we live; and **there is but one Lord, Jesus Christ**, through whom all things came and through whom we live.*

Jesus said in John 8:32 ... *and you will know the truth, and **the truth will set you free!*** Jesus is really the truth. Knowing Jesus means knowing verily the truth. Therefore, only Jesus can set us free from the untruths presented by those who preceded him, or those who came after him without the fruits of his Holy Spirit.
